

Goals for Akron Section SPE for 2015/2016

- We will partner with the Cleveland section to increase joint average monthly meeting attendance from 46 in 2014-15 to 49 by June 1 2016 by providing compelling diversified programming.
- Increase involvement with U Akron Student Chapter to increase student attendance at our Section Meetings and functions by 5% over 2014-15.
- Increase the use of social media including our website, Linked In and Face Book by creating a compelling story that will attract new members. This year will establish baseline for number of website hits.

FROM SPE



SPE Member Benefits: What Can They Do For You?

received a call the other day from Teri Chouinard, new membership chair for the SPE Automotive Division. She told me that she would be attending an upcoming event for new members and wanted to review the SPE member benefits.

I logged into 4spe.org so I could use our homepage to help navigate our conversation. We talked about the launch of THE CHAIN, SPE's very own community forum, and how members were really finding it a benefit to exchange information on all technology aspects of our industry. They like being able to ask trusted sources for help on a technical problem or new innovations.

For people seeking more extensive support, they can find a specialist in various plastics fields on SPE's Consultant Circle. Or if they're simply looking for the newest detailed technology information, all SPE members can access SPE's Online Technical Library, which contains over 25,000 research and technical papers on materials, processes, applications, etc., in polymer and plastics technology. I told her the library grows each year with over 1,000+ new papers!

We spoke about how everyone in this day and age is so busy, and they have very little time to filter the right information about what's going on in their specific part of our industry. Several members had vocalized that they received way too many general newsletters and it would be a real benefit to them to get only the current industry happenings related to their technical area. I told her that's how **PLASTICS INSIGHT**, SPE's weekly fully customizable online report of current plastics industry happenings, came to be. You can customize the report, so you only receive the information that's relevant for you or your company.

We talked about SPE's publications PLASTICS ENGINEER-ING magazine and SPE Technical Journals both having a new look and feel. She commented that she noticed the magazine had more content as well.

Meanwhile, SPE members receive discounts on all of **SPE's conferences** around the world—about 40 events per year—and on other education and training programs through the SPE, such as weekly Webinars, and on our Paulson Training, Pennsylvania College of Technology, and UL partnerships.

"SPE is partnering even more now," I said, "because we realize this really benefits our members."

SPE and SPI are partnering to offer free membership for all U.S. students. This allows students to package their SPE membership with an SPI electronic membership. This way, plastics students are networking with professionals before they even hit the workforce, making for a smoother transition at the start of their careers.

SPE has also partnered with Credible, an organization that refinances student loans, which gives SPE members and their families a simple, free service that can help them save money by comparing their options.

Teri especially liked it when I told her about SPE selling **HOP™** (Hands on Plastics™) science education kits now. We talked about how the kits contain everything needed to introduce K-8 students to the chemistry and characteristics of plastics in a classroom setting. I told her about the grandfather who purchased a kit because he volunteered to go into his grandchild's class and teach. He called me the day after to tell me the class was a success. He said it was quite easy to do because everything he needed, including the experiment instructions and the teaching tips, were in the kit.

We also spoke a bit about the Industry-Academia Collaboration committee, which connects the industry with the academic-research world for specific projects. Teri's daughter goes to one of the schools that received an equipment donation from a manufacturer. She commented on how important it is to her daughter's and other students' education for companies and universities to work together in other areas as well, like project collaboration and mentoring.

At the end of the call, I told her that if anyone had any questions or needed any more information on any of these benefits, to contact SPE staff. They would be happy to help!

2016 TPE TOPCON Update

The 12th TPE TOPCON on September 20-22 at the Akron Fairlawn Hilton will be trying something different this year. We will be holding a half-day primer on TPE basics on Tuesday afternoon. This is targeted at newcomers to the TPE industry and also those involved in production, sales or marketing who can benefit from a better understanding of TPEs. The chemistry, performance properties, formulating and applications will be covered for commodity, engineering and specialty TPEs. The TPE primer is independent and requires a separate registration fee.

The Conference this year will feature bio-renewables, additives for performance enhancement, processing scale-up, 3D printing, wearable technology and the latest material developments. We currently have twenty-six abstracts for papers with speakers from both industry and academia, and two excellent lunch keynote speakers. We will also have a student poster session presenting student polymer projects from local universities which will be included in the exhibit area.

Pinnacle - Silver is awarded to Sections and Divisions who demonstrate required activities in all four categories.

The award will be presented to the section at ANTEC in May.



March Meeting Highlights

Presentation summary of March 14 2016 SPE Cleveland-Akron Sections Technical meeting

The Solar Durability and Lifetime Extension (SDLE) Center at Case Western Reserve University (CWRU) is a world-class research center dedicated to lifetime and degradation science. Established in 2011 by Professor Roger French, the SDLE Center focuses on the durability and degradation of solar photovoltaic (PV) materials. Much of the research focuses on understanding and improving the long-term outdoor durability of polymeric materials continuously exposed to direct sunlight. We toured the "Sun Farm" (an outdoor array of instrumented and versatile solar panel mounts) and SDLE's labs (indoors).

Presentation



Roger French, Director, SDLE Research Center provides supervision for the students and the Sun Farm. Chris Littman, the Operations Manager, was our tour guide for the event and arranged for transportation to the Sun Farm. Several advanced degree students presented their projects to us in the laboratory. The projects covered a variety of tests of materials used in solar panels and evaluation of what causes corrosion and what breaks down the plastic materials. Many of the tests are done for companies that build panels and provide components to the manufacturers.

March Meeting Highlights

After dinner, Dr. Roger French presented the overall operation and objectives of the center to achieve a correlation between lab testing and field testing of solar panels. The center is certified to analyze data from several sun farms located around the USA. The other objective is to be able to forecast solar panel life of forty years. The present expected life is twenty five years.



Demonstration

Laura Bruchman, Research Professor, assisted with the tour and provided a presentation after dinner about material data analysis and testing of materials for two components.

Timothy Peshek, Research Assistant Professor, presented the operation of the sun farm. He also presented details of testing and analysis being done on the thin film that is added to the surface of the solar cell.

Thirty-six SPE members attended the meeting. The professors and students that presented their lab projects joined us for the dinner and presentations. Photos are provided of the sun farm presentation and presentations given after the dinner.
